BREAD Organization

BREAD stands for Building Responsibility, Equality and Dignity. BREAD is a justice ministry organization of 42 congregations and faith communities in central Ohio. The mission is to build the power of people of faith to solve community problems. Congregations are religiously, racially, and economically diverse. BREAD is a non-profit, non-partisan organization.

BREAD brings people of faith together to put faith into action working for justice. The organization does not provide direct services to individuals, rather, it solves the underlying problems that plague our communities and cause the need for direct services. To be successful at doing justice we have to build the power necessary to hold community leaders accountable. We exercise our power by bringing thousands of community members together from 42 congregations at our annual Nehemiah Action Assembly to press decision-makers for specific commitments to tackle community problems.

What has BREAD accomplished?

- An additional \$1 million has been invested for expanded care for people suffering from mental illness.
- Got Columbus and Franklin County to form and fund the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which has financed the development of over 13,000 units of affordable housing.
- Got Judge Elizabeth Gill to implement and establish "Restorative Justice Circles" in 9 neighborhoods throughout the county to divert non-violent, youth offenders out of the court system.


Most Recently:

- Got the Dept. of Public Safety to create the Columbus Violence Reduction initiative. In the past year 168 known members of violent groups/gangs have heard the CVR message and 88 are currently safe, alive and out of prison.
- Got the Chief of the Columbus Police Dept. to train 1,800 officers in Active, Bystandership for Law Enforcement Training (A.B.L.E.) to prepare officers to successfully intervene to prevent harm and to create a law enforcement culture that supports peer intervention.

What is a Justice Ministry/Rodef Tzedek Network Member?

They are the backbone of BREAD! Our work would not be possible without them. You can become a network member anytime of the year by making the following commitments:

- Attend the four major assemblies each year: the Annual Assembly, the Rally, the Nehemiah Action, and the Celebration;
- Bring 3 or more people with you to the Nehemiah Action; and
- Consider investing \$200 or more in the work of justice (invitation, not requirement).
